Talk, think, read, write	As part of black history month (October) watch the video interview with WWII veteran Sam King, who served in the royal air force. Find this on www.blackhistorymonth.org.uk	Celebrate the life and times of Sam King (see 2 points). This could be a PowerPoint, poster, biography... the list goes on!	Imagine that it is WWII and you have been evacuated to the countryside from the city. Write a diary entry describing your experiences as an evacuee.
The world around us	Keep a food diary for a week. You will need to record what foods you have eaten in your meals and snacks as well as your drinks.	Cook a WWII recipe. Write the recipe in your books and show a photo of the finished creation!	Learn some simple first aid. For example, how to make a sling or put somebody in the recovery position. Make a simple guide which could have been useful for a child in the war.
Design and create	Create a fabulous picture or model of a piece of WW2 technology. E.g. a Spitfire.	Design your own 'make do and mend' clothing from recycled or old material. Draw and label it. You might even make it!	Design and make a model of your own air-raid shelter, which may be an improvement on those of World War II. It should include labels and notes explaining the design features that you have chosen.
Out and about	Interview someone from your family who was alive during WWII. Or find someone who can tell you about a family member from the time of the war.	Research war time rationing. Then, make a meal that would have been made at the time and share with your family.	Visit Brighton or Worthing seafronts and piers. Research what happened to them during WWII.
History and Geography	Design a poster that encourages people to evacuate their children or join the armed forces. How will you persuade them?	Draw a world map showing the allied powers and the axis powers during WWII. How many countries were involved in the war?	Write an article about a significant person from WWII who made a significant difference. For example Neville Chamberlain, Winston Churchill, Nancy Wake or Anne Frank.

Your home learning should add up to a minimum of 10 points. This homework should be brought in on Monday 30th October so that the children can share what they have done with members of their class. Have fun!
