Talk, think, read, write	We would like you to find out as much as possible about Walter Tull, a British footballer and soldier.	As part of Anti-Bullying Week, create a campaign to raise awareness and an understanding of bullying. This theme this year is All Different, All Equal .	Write 'found' poetry. Look at poems written by others about war and collect words and phrases from them. By selecting and rearranging words and lines, create your own poems.
The world around us	Research the Dunkirk evacuation in 1940. Create a fact file to share with the class.	Research what religious festivals occur at this time of year and create posters for each.	Demonstrate to your class how to perform the simple first aid that you learned last half term.
Design and create	Pick 3 age appropriate, online computer games. Say what you like or dislike about: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The look of the game • How easy it is to understand • The graphics used 	Create a hanging decoration. This could be themed around World War 2 or may involve cooking!	Using any medium, create a scene from the Blitz.
Out and about	Interview the people at home to find out how you are similar and how you are different. Were there any surprises?	Visit a World War 2 memorial. You may want to record this with photos or with a diary entry about the day.	Investigate the changes to North Street from 1940 to present day.
History and Geography	Research how Britain celebrated Christmas throughout WW2 and present it either as a poster or an information leaflet.	Carry out a radio broadcast about either the Battle of Britain or VE day. (If you do not have the equipment to record this then bring in the script and perform to the class.)	Film an information video about what to do during a blackout.

You should aim to do at least 3 pieces. This homework should be brought in on Monday 11th December so that the children can share what they have done with members of their class at the end of this week. Have fun!
